Starting Spring 2013, and in cooperation with the Center of Language Studies at Yale, I started working on creating and developing an online bank of items using OWL software, aimed towards beginner and intermediate levels for Arabic Learners. This bank consists of items that are designed with two main purposes in mind; the first of which is to help learners reinforce their knowledge of vocabulary, grammar and phonology, and to practice their skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening until they master both these areas of knowledge and skill. The second purpose is assessing learner's performance, progress and development throughout time (one semester in this case).

In cooperation with the Center of Continuous Learning (CLC) at Yale, and through the iPad Class-set Loan Program, 12 I-pads were leaned to ARB 110 to use the OWL online test items. Data collected at the end of the semester showed that 86% of the students used OWL 2 to 3 four times per week expressing these items as "useful" and "helpful" in the process of learning.
